Alumni Spotlight: Ryan Southard '95

Arlington Catholic High School played a pivotal role in preparing me for my life's journey. Reflecting on my years there fills me with warm feelings of comfort and accomplishment.

As the Materials Director for Production Basics Inc., a leading manufacturer of ergonomic workstations, I oversee the procurement of all materials used in our manufacturing process and manage the workflow that transforms these raw materials into finished goods. Bundles of steel and other materials enter through one door, and a few weeks later, pallets of finished workstations ship out another door to a diverse range of customers across North America. It takes an absolute team effort to make this happen, and I am proud to have been a valuable member of this team for nearly 22 years.

During my time at Arlington Catholic, I was fortunate to be part of the Men's Ice Hockey team for four years under the guidance of Dan Shine, one of the most accomplished high school hockey coaches in the state. The culture that Coach Shine and his staff created emphasized hard work and preparation, giving my teammates and I an edge over our opponents every time we took the ice. represent Arlington Catholic and your fellow students, just as many of us have done before you.




